How it works. If you have:

The Underground Railroad in the Merrimack Valley

Methuen Remembers the Civil War: The Underground Railroad April 18th at 7pm

The Nevins Memorial Library in Methuen, MA will host a talk and slide show on the history of the Underground Railroad on Thursday, April 18th at 7pm. The presentation will be given by Eleanor Strang, retired director of the Kelley Library in Salem.

The Underground Railroad was the secret network in the years before the Civil War which assisted fugitive slaves as they escaped to freedom. Ms. Strang's presentation will focus on the history of this

network on a national level, and then on the abolitionist movement and Underground Railroad activities in New England, particularly New Hampshire and Massachusetts. Some of the people involved are quite well known, but many are not. One of the things Ms. Strang most enjoys about doing this presentation is the opportunity to raise awareness of the lesser known heroes who played a significant role in this critical movement.

Ms. Strang was a librarian at the Kelley Library (the public

library of Salem, New Hampshire) for over 30 years, and was its director for 15 years. Since retiring, she has pursued her interest in American history, and has presented this lecture at a variety of historical societies and public libraries. Admission to the presentation is free, and the public is invited.


